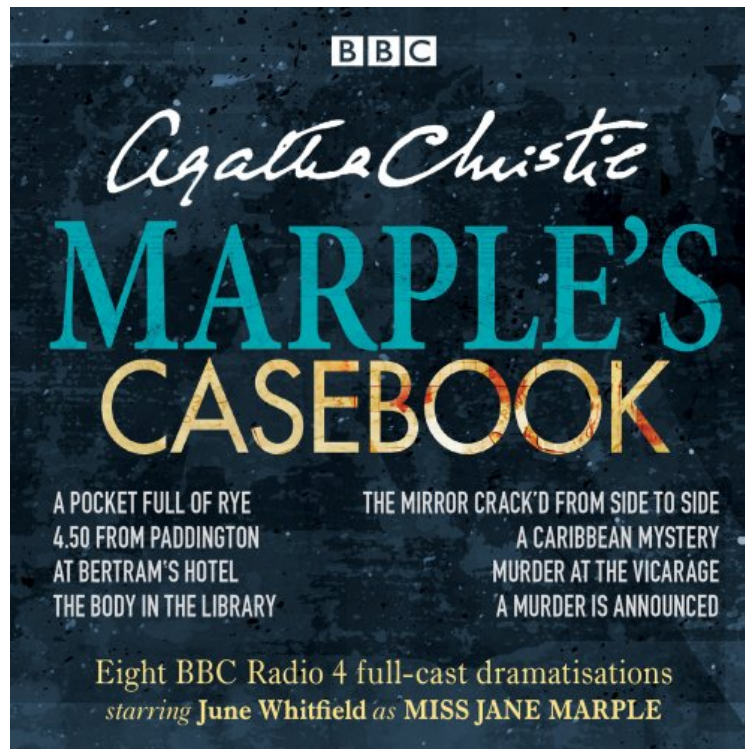

In *A Pocket Full of Rye*, a spate of unusual deaths is linked to the nursery rhyme "Sing a Song of Sixpence." In *4.50 from Paddington*, after witnessing a murder on a train, Mrs McGillicuddy calls on Miss Marple. In *At Bertrams Hotel*, crime lurks beneath the surface of a respectable Mayfair hotel. In *The Body in the Library*, a mysterious blonde is found murdered in Dolly Bantrys library. In *The Mirror Crackd from Side to Side*, at a benefit held at Gossington Hall, harmless Mrs. Badcock is fatally poisoned. In *A Caribbean Mystery*, bored in paradise, Miss Marple finds her interest aroused by an old soldier's tale. In *Murder at the Vicarage*, everyone in St Mary Mead detested Colonel Protheroe but who killed him? Finally, in *A Murder is Announced*, a startling entry in a local paper's personal column leads to a deadly shooting.
