Lousy books will have a disproportional number of lame quick fact-retrieval questions which you and I can come up with on top of our heads in seconds. These

include, but not limited to, things like Who wrote (a book)?, Who sang (a song)? Or What is the capital of (a country)? This is plain laziness. Having a couple is fine, but making book drowning with them is not - and that's what most books do. Mental_floss fans will know from their main magazine how to appreciate good trivia questions. Although my gold medal is still given to Ken Jennings's Trivia Almanac, this book is still high quality. First: this book is a whopping 800+ pages, filled to the gills with trivia. Each double-page contains 5 questions on a certain topic. No, not those generic topics like "geography", "films", "sports" ... but topics like maths in the movies, words ending in double s, hockey terms, famous Georges and so forth. These are 4-choice MCQs so questions that don't work when given possible choices aren't in this book. Give this book a try if you're looking for a better change to the monotonous ones that crowd your shelf.
