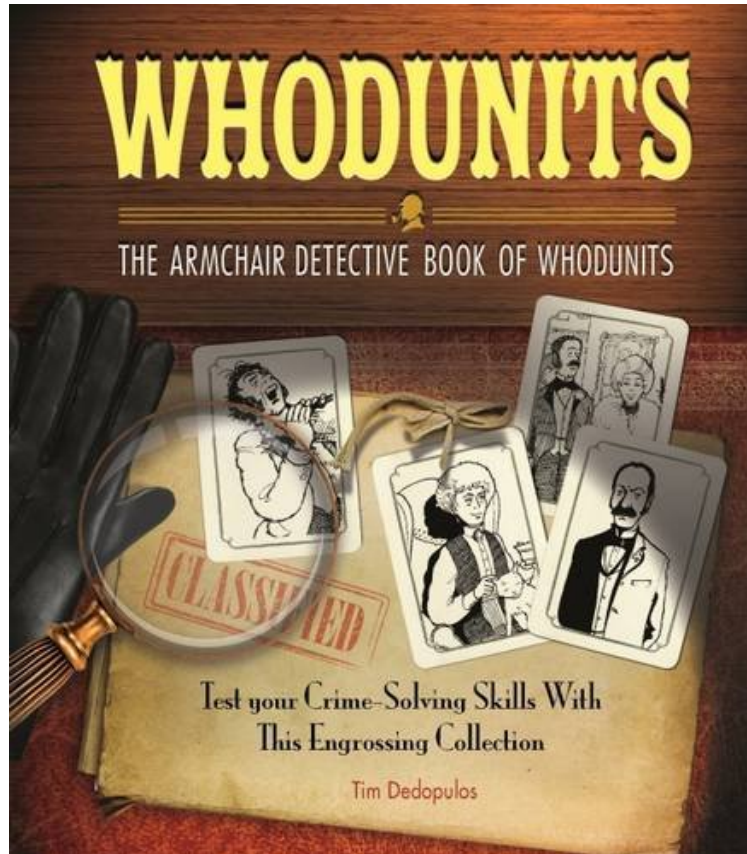

The subtle details that are supposed to be the key answer to someone's guilt don't even make sense. For example, one story states that because a boat captain once calls his ship "it" instead of "she", he is guilty of being a thief. And that is the ONLY reason he is guilty: another story finds one man guilty because his foggy memory was able to recall ONE single detail about a silk sack. It honestly makes no sense whatsoever.
