This 158-page hardcover book published in 1946 is separated into two parts, Part One: Your Technical Game and Part II: Your Psychology. It contains several bridge hand illustrations. Topics include "The Points You Lose Ignoring the

Odds," The Points You Lose NOT Doubling," "Don't Teach Your Partner," and "The Logic of Luck."
