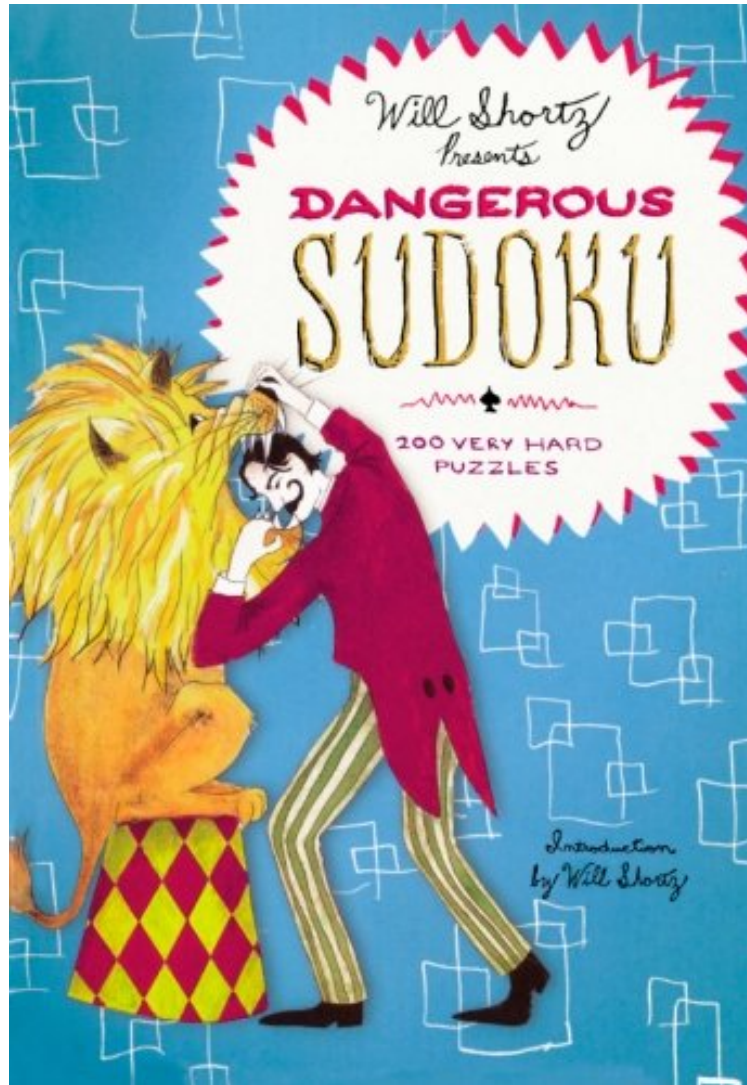

There are three levels of difficulty- Demanding, Beware Challenging and Mind Melting. I did 3 of each. The Mind Melting are a bit disappointing since I finished one in about

8 minutes. I expected these to be the most difficult. I do not use advanced solving techniques, only the basics. Beware Challenging and Demanding are fairly simple.
