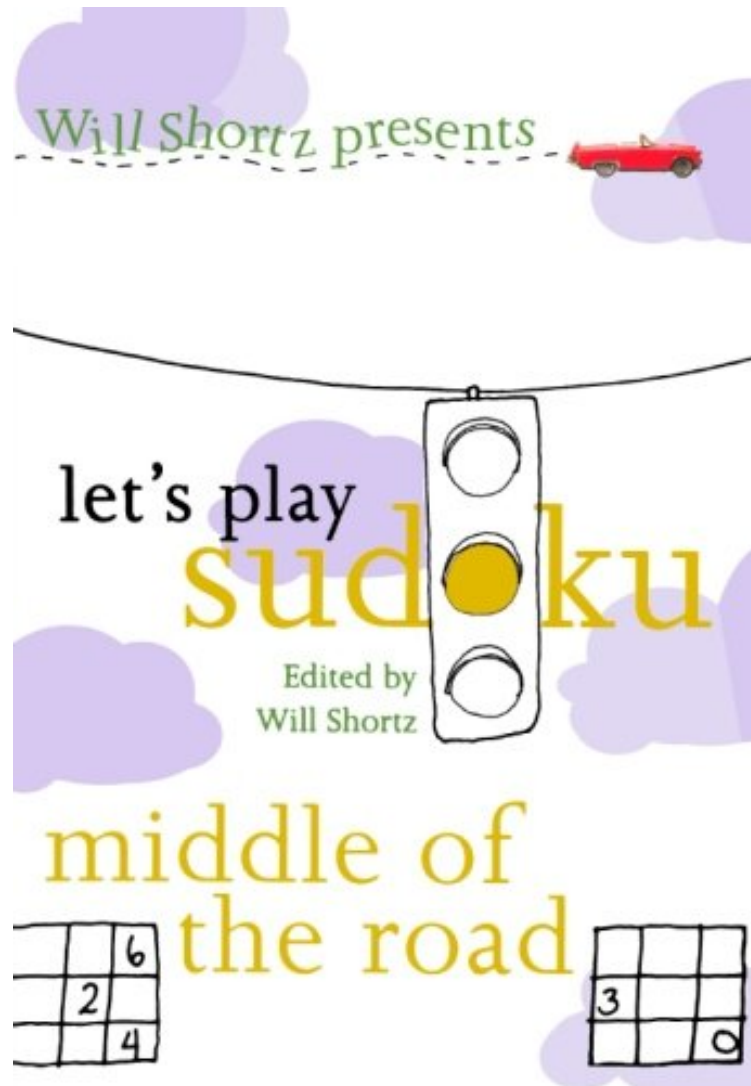

Mixed Feelings On This OneBy Wayward JimI'm still somewhat of a Sudoku beginner and have several books including the New York Post books (Easy and Medium and Difficult) plus the Will Shortz Fitness of the Mind and Middle of the Road. All of these books have one puzzle per page, which I prefer. The paper used for the Will Shortz books seems to be a lower quality than the the New York Post books. The

paper is more rough, does not erase as easily (I need to erase a lot) and it holds the pencil impression after the erasure. This makes the square a bit more difficult to read, particularly for complex puzzles with a lot of candidates for a square. I also find that the Will Shortz puzzles are a bit more difficult than book title or individual puzzle rating seem to indicate ... particularly when compared to the New York Post books. For example, the Easy, Medium, and Difficult ratings for the New York Post books are pretty much what I expect. This Will Shortz Middle Of The Road book sounds like a "medium" level difficulty ... but I find the puzzles more difficult than the New York Post Difficult book. I know, I know ... it's subjective but just a personal observation. It might be that the Will Shortz books seem to rely more on finding hidden pairs and triples than on crosshatching techniques.
