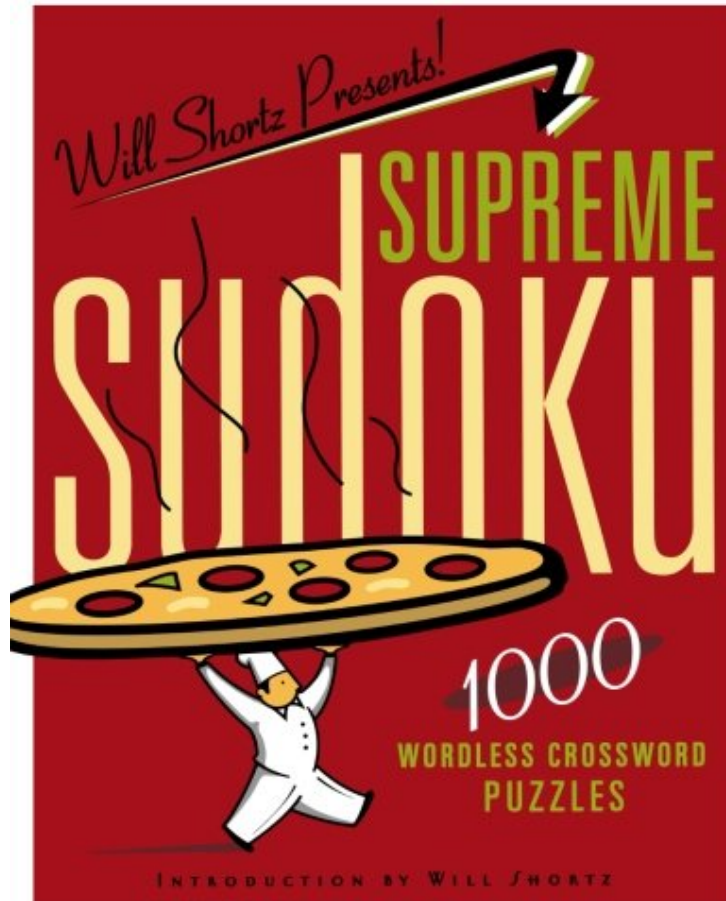

By zachariahI purchase Shortz's sudoku puzzles not only because they are invariably excellent puzzles but because the layout provides ample room above, below and at each side of the puzzle to allow neat, orderly entry of numbers belonging to that row or column. When the proper placement of those entries is clear there is no spatial error' no frame shift. Finishing the puzzles usually hinges on one key placement and because most of the unknowns are aligned in their proper plane the puzzle practically finishes itself, each entry falling into place like dominoes. All of this is to say that other publishers cheat the customer of this space, trying to squeeze as many puzzles on a page as is possible, all at the

expense of working room. ( yes, I do understand that some puzzlers write tiny numbers within the graph in the tiny little squares but I find this method messy, chaotic and prone to error) one single error and you must begin again. This is particularly annoying when working 16 x 16 puzzles. The point? I HATE this edition I'd been so eagerly awaiting. They've taken the miserly road . Now I can't even trust Will Shortz's name on the cover as a guarantee of quality. doesn't give us a sample page and I've wasted so much money on the other publishers' books, less than worthless to me. Never thought this would join the cheaters' stack destined for the trash can. How can I donate to the veterans something that irritates me so?
