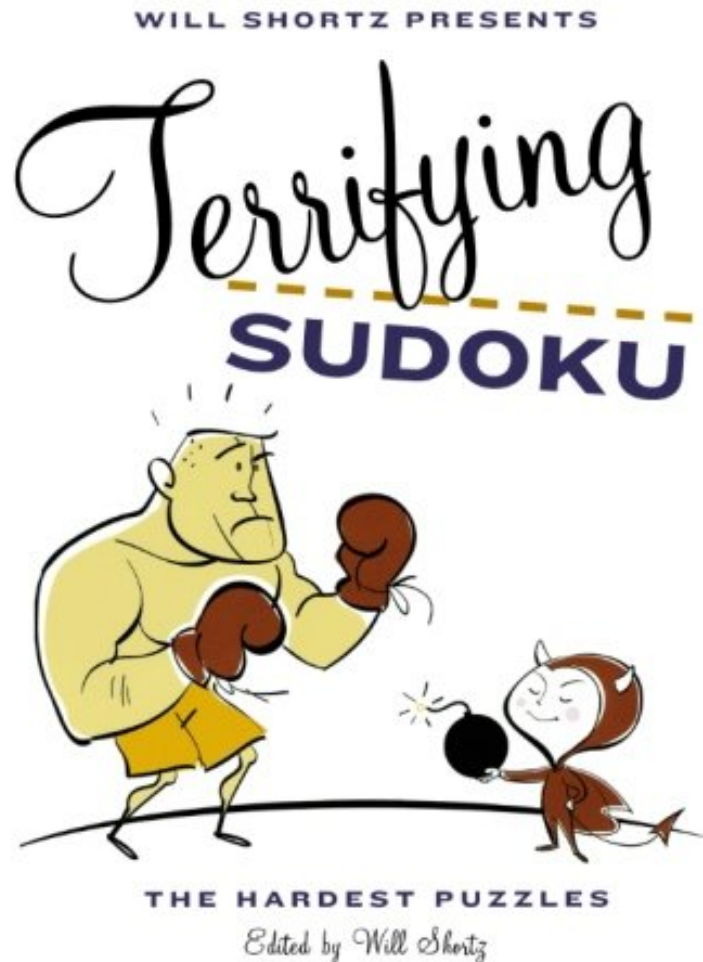

I like having a border on sides, top and bottom to work things out with a pen... another reason to go with Shortz. What would make this book better would be spiral binding so pages would lay flat. Good for you. I may be a 5 handicapper and agree with "pencil artist". I think the puzzles are challenging enough. Haven't tried menza though. Other easier Sudoku books have a reverse mirror image but shortz doesn't. That makes shortz inherently harder. 21 numbers given is around average here. I find shortz hardest very satisfying. I try to do all puzzles without marks (in my head) but end up around 50% done that way. Mind-melting is a step up from Beware Very Challenging. Don't get sloppy here.
