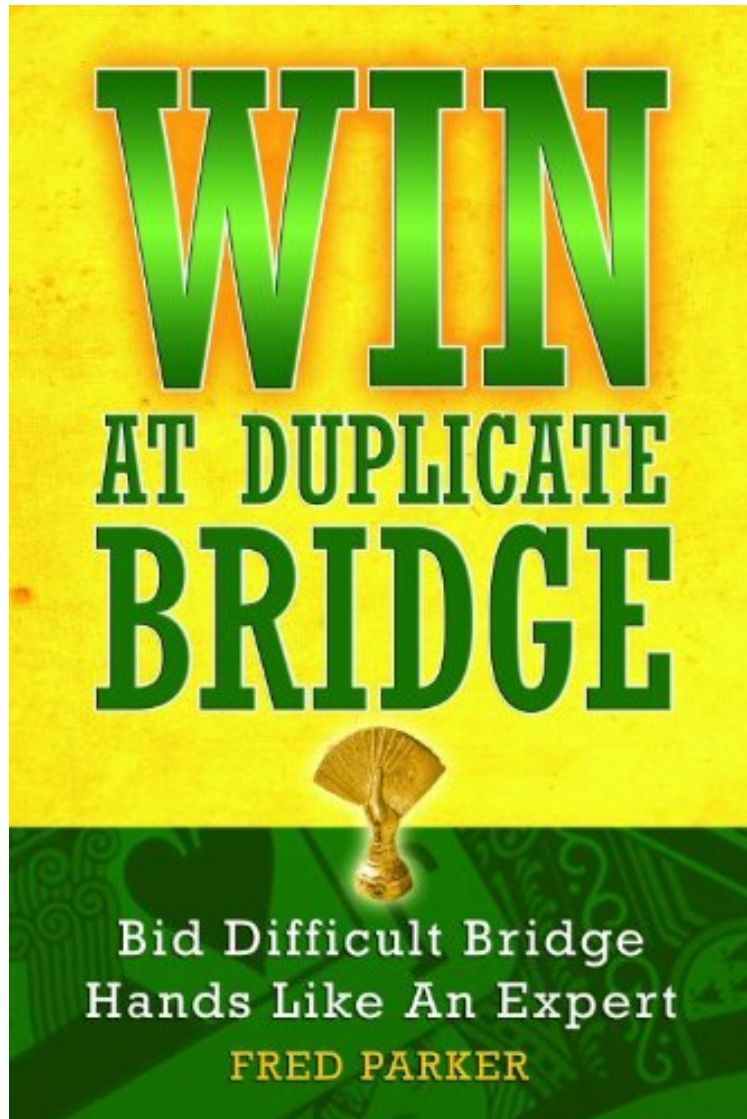

Each of the chapters on the various conventions are very thorough but also get to the specific points that must be mastered.
