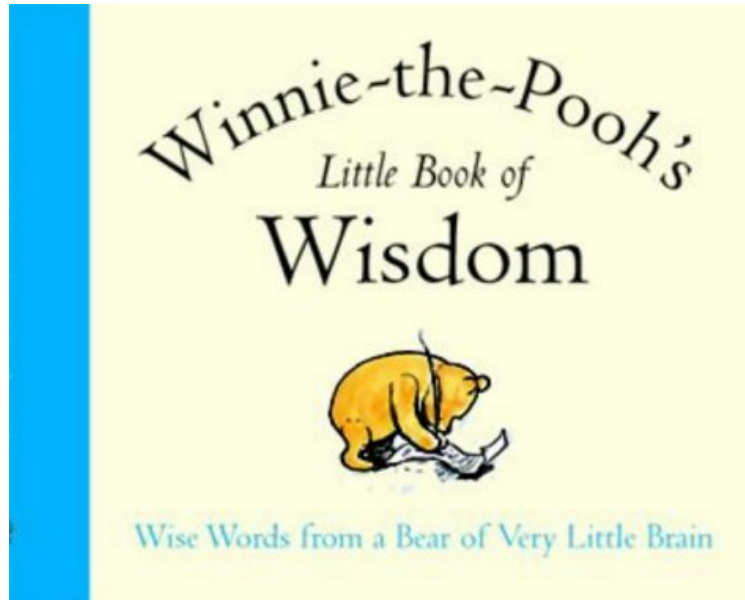

About the Author A. A. Milne wrote some 18 plays and three novels, and fathered a son, Christopher Robin Milne, in 1920. Christopher led Milne to produce a book of children's poetry, *When We Were Very Young*, in 1924, and in 1926 the seminal *Winnie-the-Pooh*. More poems followed in *Now We Are Six* (1927) and Pooh returned in *The House at Pooh Corner* (1928). E. H. Shepard famously illustrated both *Winnie-the-Pooh* and *The Wind in the Willows* though, like A. A. Milne, much of his career was devoted to work for the satirical magazine *Punch*.
